### Red Sox – 5

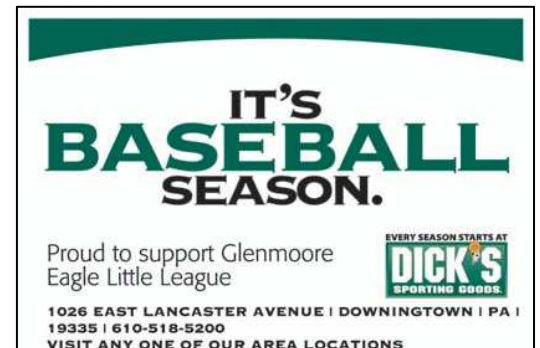
